## Clean Water for 1 Million

Last month, the Global Aid Network (GAiN, the humanitarian aid division of Power to Change) celebrated an amazing milestone. They have been drilling water wells in Africa and Asia for 10 years, and drilled their 1000th well! Since each well provides water for about a thousand people, that means a million villagers now drink from GAiN wells.



The pictures above are from the village of Peperkou, Benin. On the left, you can see the dirty water source that the villagers were relying on. The women would walk for hours to fill their buckets there, spending precious time away from their families. However, the water they brought back carried diseases which would make their families sick, impacting their ability to go to school or work.

GAiN was able to go into the village of Peperkou and drill them a deep-capped water well. Now, they have access to clean, disease free water, right in their village! When a GAiN well drilling team goes into a village like this, they spend a week working on the well and getting to know the villagers. They give sanitation and hygiene training, run medical and dental clinics, and form a bore-hole committee of locals who are trained to maintain the well long-term. They also partner with the Jesus Film project to show the Jesus Film in the local language. So far, 381,000 people have attended these Jesus Film showings, and 63,000 lives have been spiritually transformed! Where there is a local church, these new believers are plugged in to what God is already doing. Where there isn't a local church, GAiN partners with a church planting organization, and so far 365 churches have been planted!



I personally got to play a small role in helping the GAiN celebration event (for their 1 million wells) go smoothly. Two days before the event was to happen, I received a panicked email from the GAiN programmer. He had accidentally deleted all the data in the GAiN water well database program! I was able to step in and restore the data to the state it was in just before it was accidentally deleted, quickly enough so the GAiN staff could use it to continue last minute prepa-

rations for the event. I love the opportunity I have to use my skills in this and other ways to support our amazing GAiN staff as they demonstrate God's love to hurting and needy people around the world.
